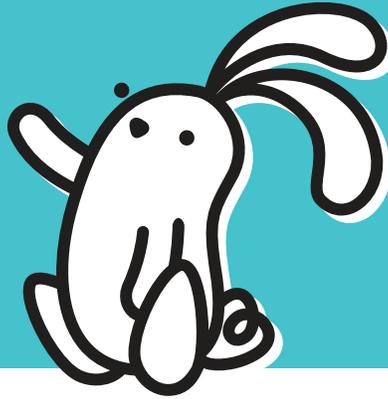


FALL 2016 KINDNESS SPOTLIGHT

Social and Emotional Learning (SEL) empowers your students in many ways. Students who are taught how to improve their SEL skills do better in school, on tests, and in life. One way to build SEL skills and encourage your students to perform acts of kindness is by adding Kindness Spotlight activities to your classes. Kindness Spotlight activities are quick and easy, yet have the power to inspire your students to be more kind.

Each month, the Random Acts of Kindness Foundation will spotlight two elementary and two middle school activities based on a Kindness Concept. Choose at least one activity to implement with your students during the month to keep kindness in the spotlight in your classes!

FAIRNESS:

- Treating people in a way that does not favor some over others.
- There's a reason we cheer on heroes who champion justice. We all value fairness (not favoring some people over others).

INTEGRITY:

- Doing what is right even when no one is watching.
- True kindness isn't done for the glory. It's done because you know it's right. That's integrity: doing what's right, even when no one is watching.

ELEMENTARY
